



----- REGULATIONS -----

Article 1 – Organisation

The "Cyclo sportive Châtel Chablais Léman Race" is a cyclo sportive event under the aegis of the French Cycling Federation (FFC) and organised by Chablais Léman Sport Organisation which will take place on Sunday 11st July 2021.

3 courses with individual time measurement of the participants will be proposed (small, medium and large), all at the start and finish in Pré-la-Joux, Châtel (Haute-Savoie).

Article 2 – Conditions of participation

The event is open to all, licensed and non-licensed cyclists and cyclo sportives aged 18 years and over (born before 01/01/2003)*.

*The short course is open to competitors aged 16 years old and over (born before 01/01/2005) subject to parental authorisation on the day of the event. A blank model of authorisation can be found online.

- FFC, UFOLEP, FSGT, FF Handisport, FFTri licensees only will have to provide a photocopy of their 2021 license at the time of registration, perfectly legible.
- FFCT, FFC Pass'Loisirs, Service, Supervision, Referee licensees must provide a photocopy of a medical certificate at the time of registration indicating that there is no contraindication to competitive cycling and that is less than 1 year old on the day of the race. The certificate must be perfectly legible, dated, signed and stamped by the doctor.

- Foreign participants, licensed or not, must provide a medical certificate in French only (or original + 1 version translated into French) indicating that there is no contraindication to competitive cycling and that is less than 1 year old on the day of the race.

A blank template of a medical certificate is available online.

Without a valid license or medical certificate, the withdrawal of the bib will be refused. No discharge from responsibility will be accepted.

To participate at the event, all participants acknowledge:

- Having read the present rules and regulations and accepting the clauses in their integrality
- Be aware of the risks associated with cycling, such as individual or collective falls.
- Have acquired a confirmed cycling level
- Be fully aware of the difficulty of the event
- Knowing how to manage the realities of driving on uneven roads and in climatic conditions that can be difficult (heavy rain, cold...).
- Show respect for the private property that the route takes them through.
- Provide assistance and rescue to all participants at difficulty
- Comply with the compulsory equipment

Participants compete on an individual basis. The organizer reserves the right to limit the number of participants without notice.

Article 3 – Route & Timetable

Article 3a – Route

- Small: Fictitious start at 8am from Centre Mondial du Cyclisme – UCI, Aigle (Swiss). Finish line Pré-la-Joux, Châtel (Haute-Savoie)
- Medium: Fictitious start at 7.30 am from Pré-la-Joux, Châtel (Haute-Savoie). Finish line at the same place.
- Large : Fictitious start at 7am from Pré-la-Joux, Châtel (Haute-Savoie). Finish line at the same place.

Participants will be called 15 minutes before the start on the line for a reminder of the instructions. It is the responsibility of each participant to arrive on time for the registration, briefing and start of the event.

The roads will be open to traffic, riders must scrupulously respect the highway code, drive on the right and adapt their speed. The organization reserves the right to exclude any participant who does not respect the highway code.

Article 3b – Time limits

Time barriers will be put in place:

- Passage at Saint Paul before 1.00 pm (medium)
- Passage at UCI Aigle before 11.50am (Large)
- Passage at Champéry before 1.15 pm (small & large)
- Arrival of all competitors before 3pm at Pré-la-Joux, Châtel.

Outside the time barriers, the broom wagon will remove the participants' race numbers and double them. The participants will then find themselves in real traffic conditions (no flagmen, but the arrows will remain on).

The route is defined subject to prefectural authorization and can be modified by the organizer if necessary.

Article 3c - Showers & Meal

The sanitary facilities and showers (separate men and women) as well as the catering area will be located in the start/finish village of the event at Pré-la-Joux, Châtel. Each participant will receive his or her individual ticket for the meal when picking up his or her

race number. Additional tickets can be purchased at the village reception point or when picking up your race number.

Article 4 – Obligatory equipment

Competitors are solely responsible for the conformity in accordance with the standards in force, the equipment they use and its maintenance.

Article 4a – Bike

VTC, unicycle, recumbent bikes, time trial bikes, fixed-gear bikes, folding bikes, handbikes, bikes with spoked wheels and/or lenticular wheels are not allowed. Electric bikes are only allowed on the small course. (hiking mode, without classification).

Article 4a – Equipment

Each participant must present themselves at the start with the cycling and sports equipment listed below, as well as with the rigid helmet on their head and chinstrap attached and keep it with them throughout the event (compulsory).

Without the helmet at the start, the competitor will not be allowed to start the race (withdrawal of the race number). In the absence of the helmet during the race, the competitor may be excluded.

Wearing the equipment listed below is recommended for the entire duration of the event, including the fictitious start:

- Wearing a rigid-shell helmet (CE standards), approved with the chinstrap attached. MANDATORY. Participants lose the benefit of insurance cover if they do not wear a helmet.
- A bicycle pump, a spare inner tube or an anti-puncture spray, if the bicycle is not equipped with tubeless
- A pair of gloves
- At least 50cl of water at the start of the race.
- A mobile phone that is switched on, fully charged and equipped with a GPS device.

In the event of failure to wear the recommended equipment, the organization cannot be held responsible for any incidents and their consequences.

Competitors are responsible for the proper functioning and supervision of their equipment. The participants acknowledge the organizer's non-responsibility for the surveillance of goods or objects in the event of theft or loss. A bicycle park will be set up near the dining room at Pré-la-Joux, Châtel). The participants acknowledge that the organizers cannot be held responsible for the surveillance of personal property or objects in the event of theft or loss. Objects, accessories or bicycles handed over to third parties during the event (members of the organization or not) will be under the full responsibility of the depositing participant.

Wearing the race jersey offered to each participant is compulsory. Participants not wearing the jersey will not take part in the draw (specific rules for the draw are available on the event site).

Article 5 – Registration

Registration open ONLINE from 19 November 2020 20h to Friday 09 2021, 23h59. The registrations are exclusively made through this digital means also on site the day before or on the day of the event for health and environmental reasons (Timetable in Article 6).

To validate his online registration, the participant must fill in all the mandatory fields of the form accurately, commit to provide a real and active e-mail address, of which he is indeed the exclusive owner.

The organizer is the sole decision-maker for the selected participants and no dispute will be admissible. All entries are firm and final. It is forbidden to give or resell one's race number.

With the exception of a medical impossibility or force majeure justified by a certificate before 09/07/2021, no reimbursement will be made by the organizer.

The registration fee includes:

- Participation in the event via a numbered chip and plate,
- 1 collector's jersey
- 1 welcome pack,
- Solid and liquid fuel(s) on the course
- Medical assistance (during the race and in the village) and technical assistance (in the

village)* in addition to conventional and public rescue services. The other costs of medical care, surgery, hospitalisation, evacuation and repatriation remain the responsibility of the participants.

- Mechanical assistance the day before and on the day of the race
- Race safety with motorbikes (50), cars (10) and volunteers (150)
- Free access to the exhibition area of the village
- Car parking near the start/finish line.
- Bike park at the finish
- 1 medal and diploma for finishers
- Access to showers and toilets
- An after-race meal
- Participation in the draw (in accordance with the specific rules of the draw, available on the event's website).

Article 6- Bib numbers

Bibs (large, medium and small circuit) will be to be collected on Saturday 10th July from 9am to 6.45pm at Pré-la-Joux, Châtel. No race numbers will be issued at Aigle, UCI World Cycling Centre on Saturday 10 July.

There will be a stand-by service for latecomers on the morning of the race (11/07) from 6.00 am to 7.45 am at Pré-la-Joux, Châtel for participants on the Middle and Long Course and at UCI World Cycling Centre, Aigle from 7.00 am to 7.45 am for participants of the small route.

You will have to bring the confirmation of your registration as well as your coin from identity or license. The timing chips will be attached to the front of the bike. People who have not validated their registration (medical certificate...) will have to present the supporting documents to the permanence.

Race numbers will be allocated in the order in which the registration forms are received. The organizer reserves the right to issue priority numbers. A request can be sent to contact@chatelchablaislemanrace.com

Article 7- Categories, Awards and Endowment

The first 3 of the men's and women's scratch rankings of the 3 circuits will be rewarded. The first 3 in each category below, men and women, will also be rewarded. The time of the award ceremony will be

communicated later on the event's website and announced at the microphone of the speaker on the day of the event. The awards ceremony will take place on the day of the event. The rewards are distributed by the partners to the winners. No prize can be exchanged, refunded or sent. No rewards will be given in cash.

Categories men and women*:

- Women C1 18/30 (small circuit 16/30)
- Woman C2 31/40
- Woman C3 41/50
- Woman C4 51/60
- Woman C6 61++

- Male C1 18/30 (small circuit 16/30)
- Male C2 31/40
- Male C3 41/50
- Male C4 51/60
- Male C6 61++

* age in the current year.

The disabled category will also be rewarded according to the registrations.

An exceptional draw (value to be communicated later) will take place after the prize-giving ceremony. The prizes will be awarded exclusively to those present and having worn the jersey offered during the event. Drawing of lots subject to a specific rules submitted and a bailiff's control. Prize money and rules to be consulted on the event website.

Article 8- Special points during the event

8a – Following cars

Follower cars are forbidden.

A broom wagon will circulate at the end of the event (for each course) and will be able to ensure the repatriation of competitors who are victims of major mechanical incidents.

Each competitor must be autonomous and must leave with a minimum repair kit.

8b – Feed zones

Several refreshments are organized on the course. They will be indicated on the maps and course profiles and reminded to participants at the start of the event.

Competitors may be supplied by their companions at other points on the course, provided that the refreshments are provided by a pedestrian on the right-hand side of the road and that they do not affect the safety of the event and the other participants.

The refueling of a participant from a moving vehicle is forbidden and will result in the immediate disqualification of the participant.

8c – Shuttle Petit Parcours

As the finish of the short course is in Châtel Pré-la-Joux and the start in Aigle UCI World Cycling Centre, the organisation offers a shuttle service on the morning of the race. It is then possible to drop off your vehicle at the finish site (Pré la Joux Châtel) on the morning of the event and make the journey to the start by BUS shuttle (shuttle departure at 6.40am).

To do so, it is essential to have dropped off the bike the day before at the UCI World Cycling Centre (guarded bike park) and to have reserved the shuttle at the time of registration.

On the morning of the event you can leave your clothes in the deposit box. They will be brought to the finish in Châtel.

8d- Eco-friendly behaviour

You are going to cross magnificent landscapes, and, as in any place, it is strictly forbidden to throw away your waste (cans, energy bar paper, plastics etc.).

At each refreshment station, at the start and at the finish, you will have selective sorting bins for your rubbish. The organizers reserve the right to exclude on the spot any participants throwing their rubbish at the roadside who do not respect these instructions. Those who are excluded from the race will be removed from the draw.

8e - "Fair-play" behaviour

Competitors who do not respect the sporting spirit and "fair play" of the event, who are caught in a situation of fraud (failure to comply with the airlock, early departure, route not respected, use or assistance of vehicles, etc), or who have irresponsible or even dangerous behaviour or practices (making disrespectful or insulting remarks, incivilité, use of doping products, throwing objects, documents or waste, dangerous driving, breach of the highway code, etc) will be sanctioned as appropriate: time penalties

from 5 minutes to 2 hours, downgrading and up to exclusion from the event or even from the following events.

Article 9 – Insurance

Civil liability: the organizers have taken out a contract covering their civil liability as well as that of the participants involved. It takes effect only on the official route and for the duration of the event, for participants who are regularly registered, checked at the start, on the course and up to the finish.

Individual accident: It is up to the participants to guarantee themselves at the time of registration.

Damage and material liability: Neither the organizer nor its insurer will cover damage to the material and equipment of the participants, particularly in the event of a fall or theft. It is the responsibility of each participant to take out a guarantee.

Article 10- Exceptional conditions and cancellation

Registration is firm and final.

If circumstances so require, the organizer reserves the right to modify at any time the General Terms and Conditions of Sale (course, starting times and any other organizational point linked to the smooth running of the event...) as well as the Event Regulations.

In case of force majeure independent of its willingness, too unfavorable weather conditions, pandemics or any other circumstance endangering the competitors' security, the organization reserves the right:

- To modify / postpone the departure time by a maximum of a few hours.
- To shorten or neutralize the test
- To stop the ordeal
- Cancel the event

In the event of a change, the organizer will endeavor to notify all registered participants by e-mail, to the address they provided on the registration form. Any modification made shall apply immediately after has been notified, by any means, including publication of the revised version hereof on the event site.

If the event is cancelled due to force majeure or by decision of the prefect for reasons beyond the

organizer's control, the organization is relieved of any recourse by the entrants. No reimbursement will be made.

The organizer reserves the right to inform the participant of the conditions for postponing registration. The announcement will be made electronically at the address provided by the participant, on the event's website, or on the day of the event, by microphone, by posting on the reception and registration points.

In the event of non-participation for serious reasons: accident, illness, total incapacity, etc., the registration fee will only be reimbursed upon written and justified request (medical certificate) before Friday 09 July (postmark).

Article 11- Image rights

By registering, the participant authorizes the organizer, its partners and the media to use the photos on which he or she may appear on the day of the event.

The use of these images may in no way infringe à the privacy or reputation of the participant.

Article 12 - Personal data

Participants are informed that the personal data collected is subject to computer processing exclusively intended to enable the communication of information exclusively related to the event by the organizer of the " Cyclosportive Châtel Chablais Léman Race" event. Chablais Léman Sport Organization, which is responsible for this processing, undertakes not to communicate the personal data thus collected to third parties.

In accordance with Order no. 2018-1125 of 12 December 2018 taken in application of article 32 of Law no. 2018-493 of 20 June 2018 relating to the protection of personal data and amending Law no. 78-17 of 6 January 1978 relating to information technology, files and liberties and various provisions concerning the protection of personal data, each participant has the right to access, rectify and oppose the processing of data concerning him or her by justifying his or her request to the Organizer at identity by sending a letter to : Mr. President Sébastien MEDAN, Chemin de la Forêt, 74200 Thonon-les-Bains.

This authorization is valid for the duration of the copyright as from July, 11 2021.

Article 13 - Antidoping

The " Cyclosportive Châtel Chablais Léman Race" is under the aegis of the FFC, therefore anti-doping controls may take place on the day of the event.

Article 14 - Régulation validation

Registration for the " Cyclosportive Châtel Chablais Léman Race" implies knowledge and unreserved acceptance of integrality of the present regulations (14 articles) as well as of the ethics of the event and of all the instructions that the organizer sends to the participants.
